## — Romans 7.2-6 — Pentecost 2025 Pentecost - Old Testament and New

Rm 7 2 [T]he woman who has a husband is bound by the law to her husband as long as he lives. But if the husband dies, she is released from the law of her husband. 3 So then if, while her husband lives, she marries another man, she will be called an adulteress; but if her husband dies, she is free from that law, so that she is no adulteress, though she has married another man. <sup>4</sup>Therefore, my brethren, you also have become dead to the law through the body of Christ, that you may be married to another to Him who was raised from the dead, that we should bear fruit to God. <sup>5</sup> For when we were in the flesh, the sinful passions which were aroused by the law were at work in our members to bear fruit to death. 6 But now we have been delivered from the law, having died to what we were held by, so that we should serve in the newness of the Spirit and not in the oldness of the letter.

► Christians rightly think of Pentecost as Christ pouring out his Spirit upon his disciples, but it comes as a shock to most Christians to learn that the very first Pentecost was the giving of the \_\_\_\_\_ at Mt Sinai (Ex 19-20).

Rom 7 9 I was alive once apart from the law, but when the commandment came, sin came alive and I died ... <sup>12</sup> [T]he law is ... holy, just, and good ... <sup>14</sup> ... the law is spiritual.

- ▶ It is the connection between the law and the Spirit and \_\_\_\_ that we must understand to fully understand and appreciate Pentecost. That's exactly what Paul is explaining to us in our sermon text. You see, \_\_\_\_\_ are the woman (1Cor 10.1-11).
- ▶ Scripture presents the proceedings at Mt Sinai as a spiritual ceremony between God and the people, with the ten commandments as the wedding \_\_\_\_\_ of the bride (e.g., Ex 20.2).

Ex 203 "You shall have no other gods before Me."

Jer 22 Thus says the Lord: "I remember ... the love of your betrothal, when you followed Me in the wilderness."
